Role of CERT:



- Prepare citizens to respond to and cope with the aftermath of a disaster by;
- supplement first responders, civilians can be recruited and trained as teams that, in essence, will be auxiliary responders.
- These groups can provide immediate assistance to victims in their area;
- organize spontaneous volunteers who have not had the training;
- collect disaster intelligence.

Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS or "drones")

Deputy Dan Paige Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department

An Unmanned Aircraft is an Aircraft that Must Comply with Safety Requirements

(1) Capable of sustained flight in the atmosphere;
(2) Flown within visual line of sight of the person operating the aircraft; and (3) Flown for hobby or recreational purposes.

Flight restrictions are used to protect, but are not limited to, special security events, sensitive operations (e.g., select Law Enforcement activity, space flight operations, etc.), and Presidential movement. The most up-to-date list of TFRs is available at http://tfr.faa.gov/tfr2/list.html.

Commercial and Other Non-Model Aircraft UAS Operations





Map Your Neighborhood Program for Altadena Community Preparedness Steve Reagan



What is "Map Your Neighborhood?"

 Build Disaster Readiness among Neighbors

Neighbors that are prepared:

- Saves Lives
- Reduce severity of injuries and trauma.
- Reduce property damage
- Work as a team to strengthen communities.
- Improve their quality of life.

What is "Map Your Neighborhood?"

- Nine (9) Steps to take immediately following a disaster.
- Develop a neighborhood skills and equipment inventory.
- Map your neighborhood to identify areas of concern: water, gas, electricity, elderly and special needs.

Preview of MYN

- Shingles 9 Steps to prepare your neighborhood.
 - Meeting in a private home
 - Invite 15-20 of your immediate neighbors
 - For Example- afternoon for 2-4 hours
 - Steps 1-6 Take care of yourself, your family and your home.
 - Steps 7-9 Meet up, teams, survey, report.

Preview of MYN

- Shingles Go home with your neighbors.
 - Includes a Map of each home, shutoffs, hazards.
 - Window signs "HELP" or "OK"
- DVD Step-by-step for discussion and planning by your neighbors.
- Steps 7-9 include a walking tour of your neighborhood to make the Map.

Why is it important??

- Emergency or Disaster???
- Evacuation or Shelter in place??
- Nobody is prepared!
- Your neighbor's problem is also your problem!
- Shared resources for the benefit of all.
- Cooperation, Communication, Care

 - 59% of 6.7+ on Section of San Andreas
 - 12+ Moderate quakes since 1935
 - 5-7 Major quakes in the last 1,100 years.


Mission Statement for A.L.E.R.T.
