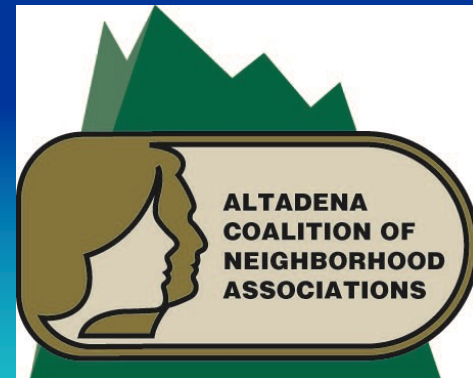

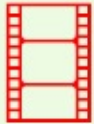

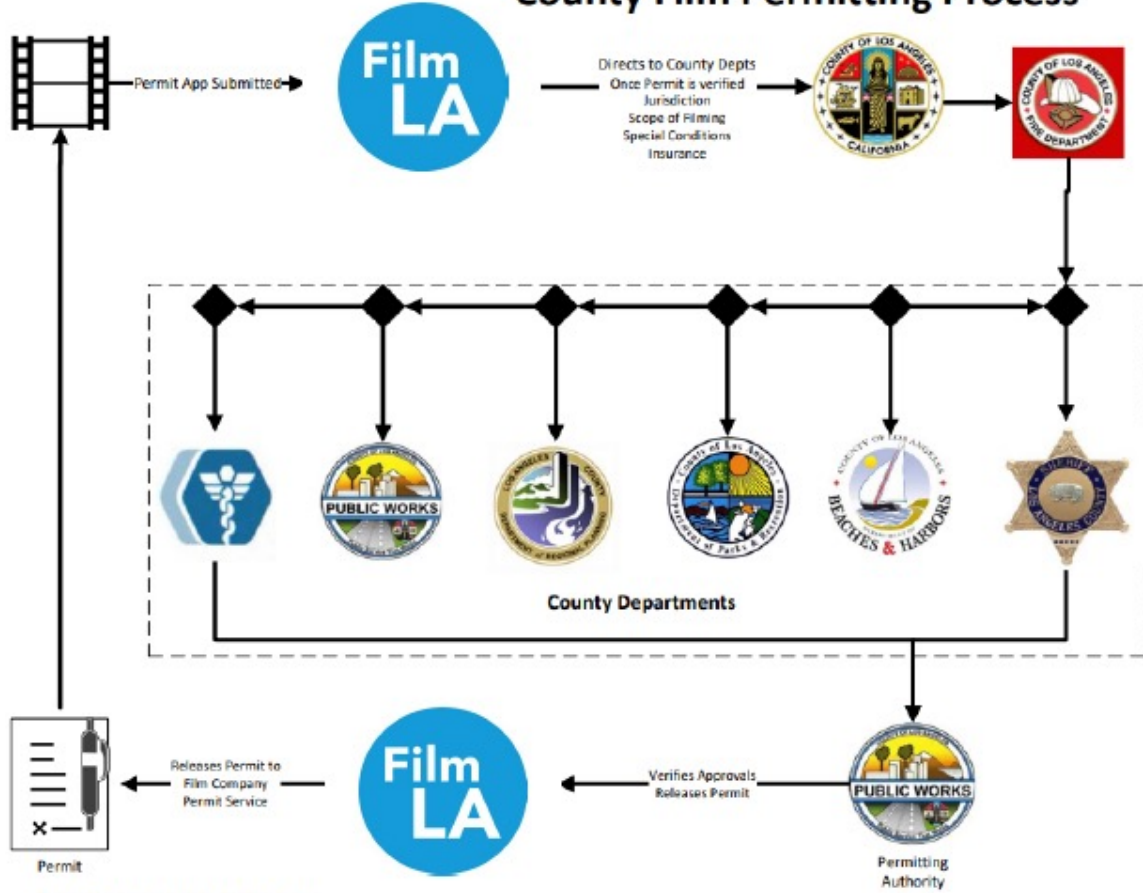

County Film Permitting Process



- ### Process Steps
- Film Company/Permit Service submits App
 - FilmLA receives App
 - **Verifies:**
Filming/Photography etc.
Special Conditions
Reservations (DBH)
Insurance
 - FilmLA directs Film Company/Permit Service to respective County Dept for approval
 - Fire Department signs off on all Permits
 - If Shooting in the Santa Monica Mtns or a Structure is needed – DRP
 - If Shooting at a Beach – DBH Reservation System
 - If Shooting at a Park – DPR Reservation System and Respective Park Signoff
 - If Shooting at LA-USC – DHS Location Agreement
 - If Firearms/Explosives needed – Sheriff or Highway Patrol
 - If Road Closure needed – Sheriff or Highway Patrol
 - If Road Closure needed – DPW Signoff
 - DPW verifies all respective steps and Approves Permit in DPS system
 - FilmLA Releases Permit to Film Company/Permit Service
 - Film Company surveys and notices Community
 - Film Shoot Begins

 DPW: Department of Public Works
 DPR: Department of Parks and Recreation

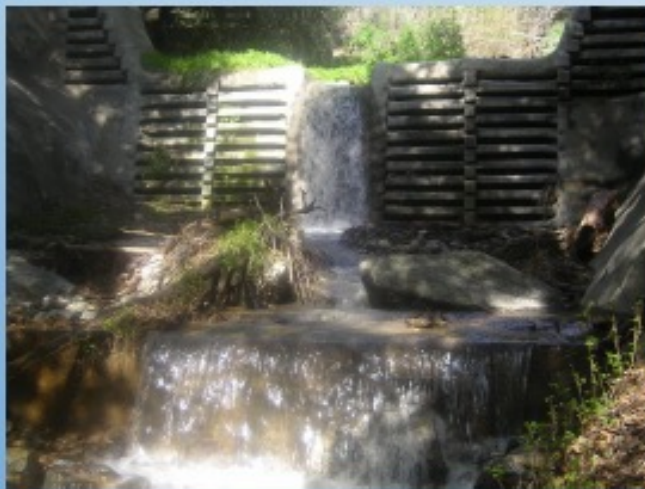

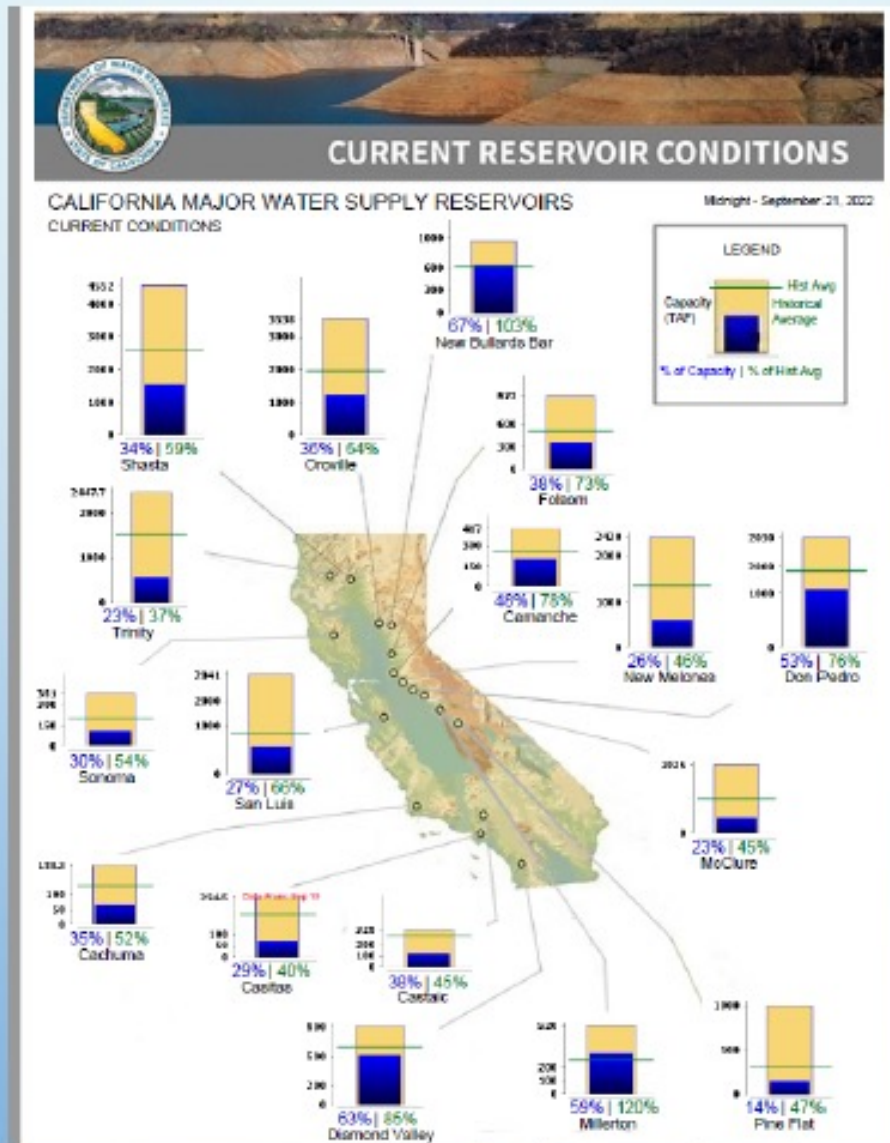

Waste Hauler

- Universal Waste Systems Inc. has been servicing Los Angeles County since 1986. President Mark Blackburn has been in the waste industry for over 35 years, and is President of the Los Angeles County Disposal Association.

Organic/ Food Waste in the Green

Senate Bill 1383- Organics Waste Reduction

- Requires 75% reduction of organic waste to the landfill by 2025
- Regulations require recovery of excess edible food
- New requirements are effective January 1, 2022

What Can Go in the Green Cart?

YES! : ALL FOOD SCRAPS

Vegetables, Fruits, Meat, Eggs and Shells, Coffee Grounds, Bread, Cheese, Pasta, and All Food and Yard Waste.

NO! : Recyclables, Trash, Compostable Plastic, Hazardous Waste, Oil, Gloves, Stickers, Ties, Food Packaging and All Non-Food Items.



Important Dates

- **Cart distribution**
 - New Carts will be delivered between September 12 and September 30th.
 - Each home will receive three carts (Gray 96 gallon, Blue 96 gallon, and Green 96 gallon). If you have additional containers with your previous service provide UWS will attempt to deliver those containers on the initial delivery.
 - To request additional containers or to change container size please contact customer service after October 15, 2022.
- **New Collection Starts**
 - October 1st, 2022
- **End Date of Current Service Provider**
 - September 30th, 2022

Standard Service

Residential Customers:

Cost for Basic Service-

Regular Fee \$97.74/quarter (\$32.58/ month)

With Senior Discount \$ 73.32/quarter (\$24.44/ month)

- 3 - 96 gallon carts (Gray – Trash, Blue- Recycling, and Green for Yard Waste and Food Waste/Organics)
- Weekly automated service
- Bulky Item Collection (unlimited quantities 4 times per year)
- E-Waste/CED collection (10 items per year)



Additional Services

- Additional Carts: UWS will provide additional carts. A fee will be per cart depending on size requested as outlined below:

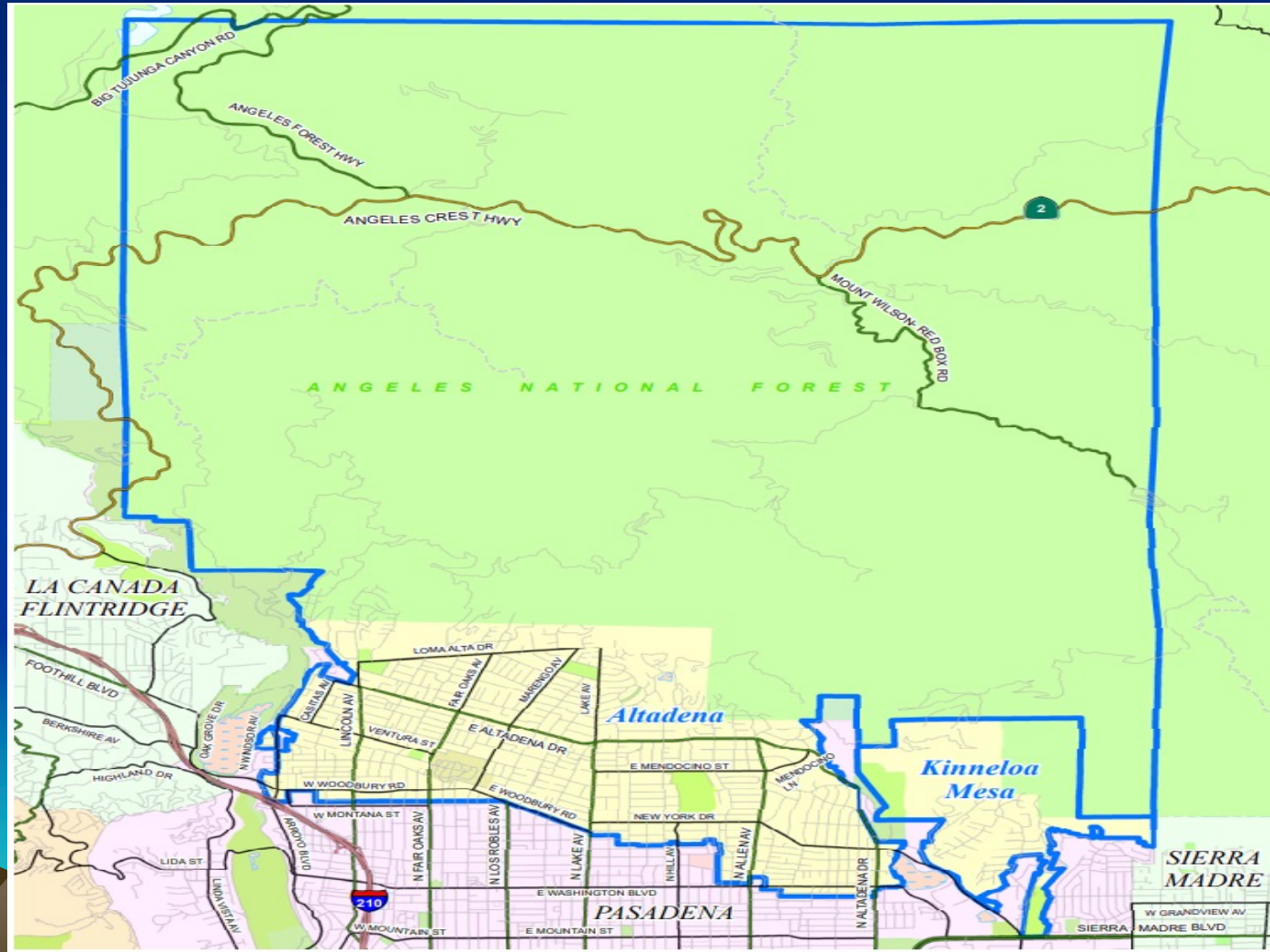
- Refuse Cart \$13.00 per month
- Recyclables Cart \$ 3.75 per month
- Organics Cart \$ 7.85 per month

Customers requesting exchanges for different size carts will not be charged the first time, and additional exchanges will be billed at \$16.29/ exchange.

- Roll Out/backyard service:
 - Free to qualifying disabled and/or elderly residents.
 - A quarterly charge of \$48.87 per quarter will be charged to non qualifying residents.

Collection Schedule

Universal Waste Systems Inc. will not be changing the collection schedule.

Where should I place my carts?

- Place your 3 carts on the street closest to the curb at least 18” apart from each other the night before your collection day or the day of by 6 a.m.
- Collection vehicles will pass by to collect each container at different times on your collection day



Bulky items & Missed pick-ups

- Bulky items and E-waste (sofa, TV, etc..) should be placed on the curb. Do not place bulky items or e-waste on the street.
- A call to customer service prior to collection will insure proper set out and timely collection.
- Missed pick-ups. If your cart is not serviced contact UWS (800) 631-7016
 - If you call before 3 p.m. on your collection day, it will be serviced by 6 p.m. on the same day
