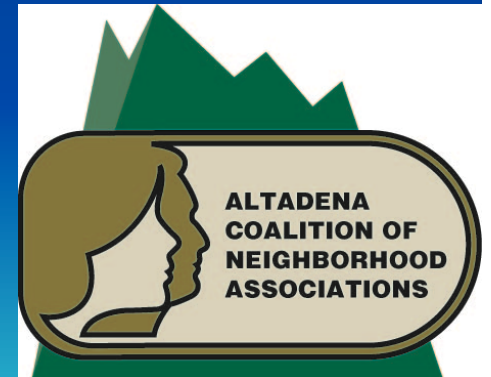

Have you registered your front yard fence, wall, or hedge? The registration deadline has been extended to July 1, 2019!

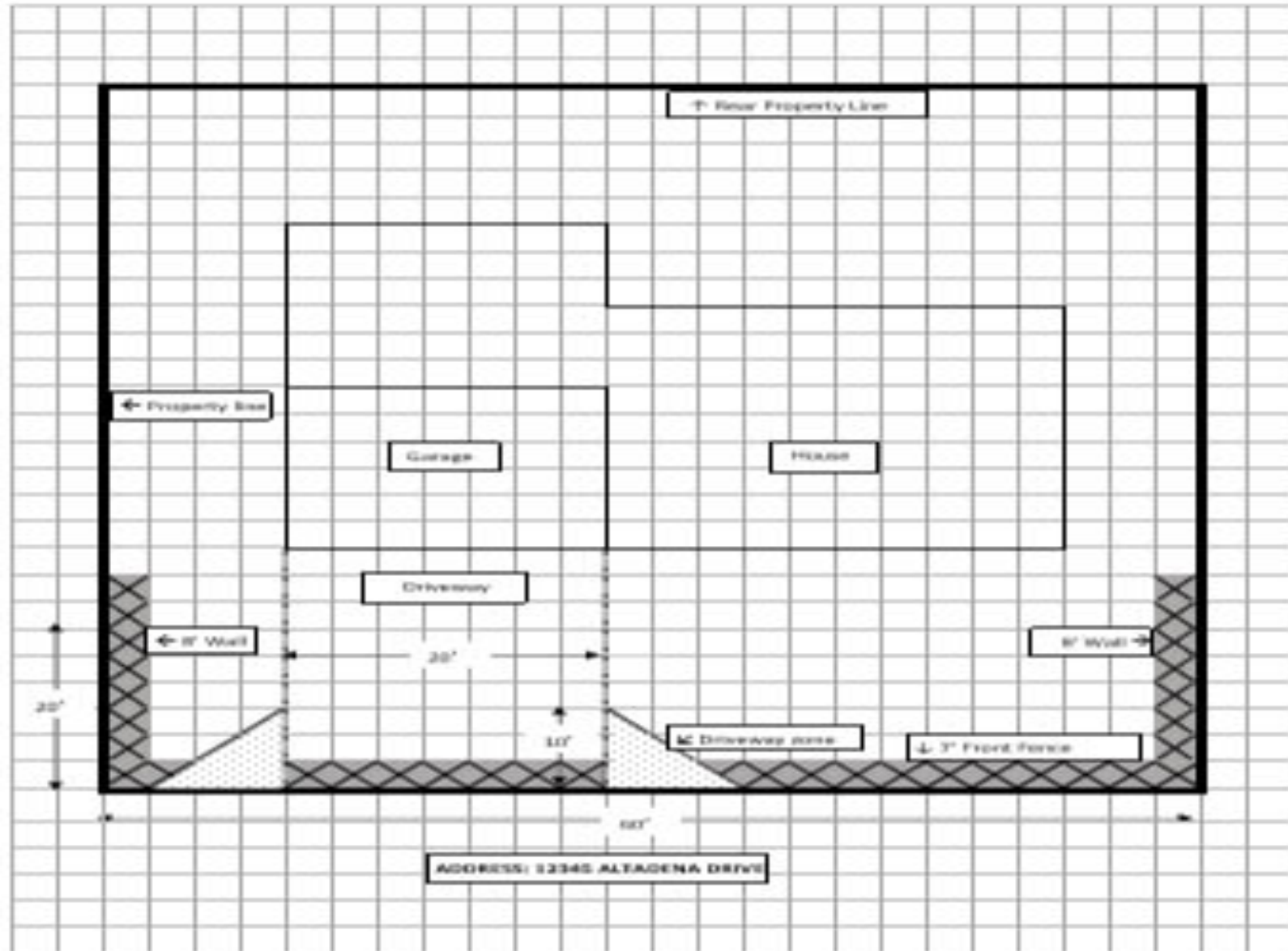

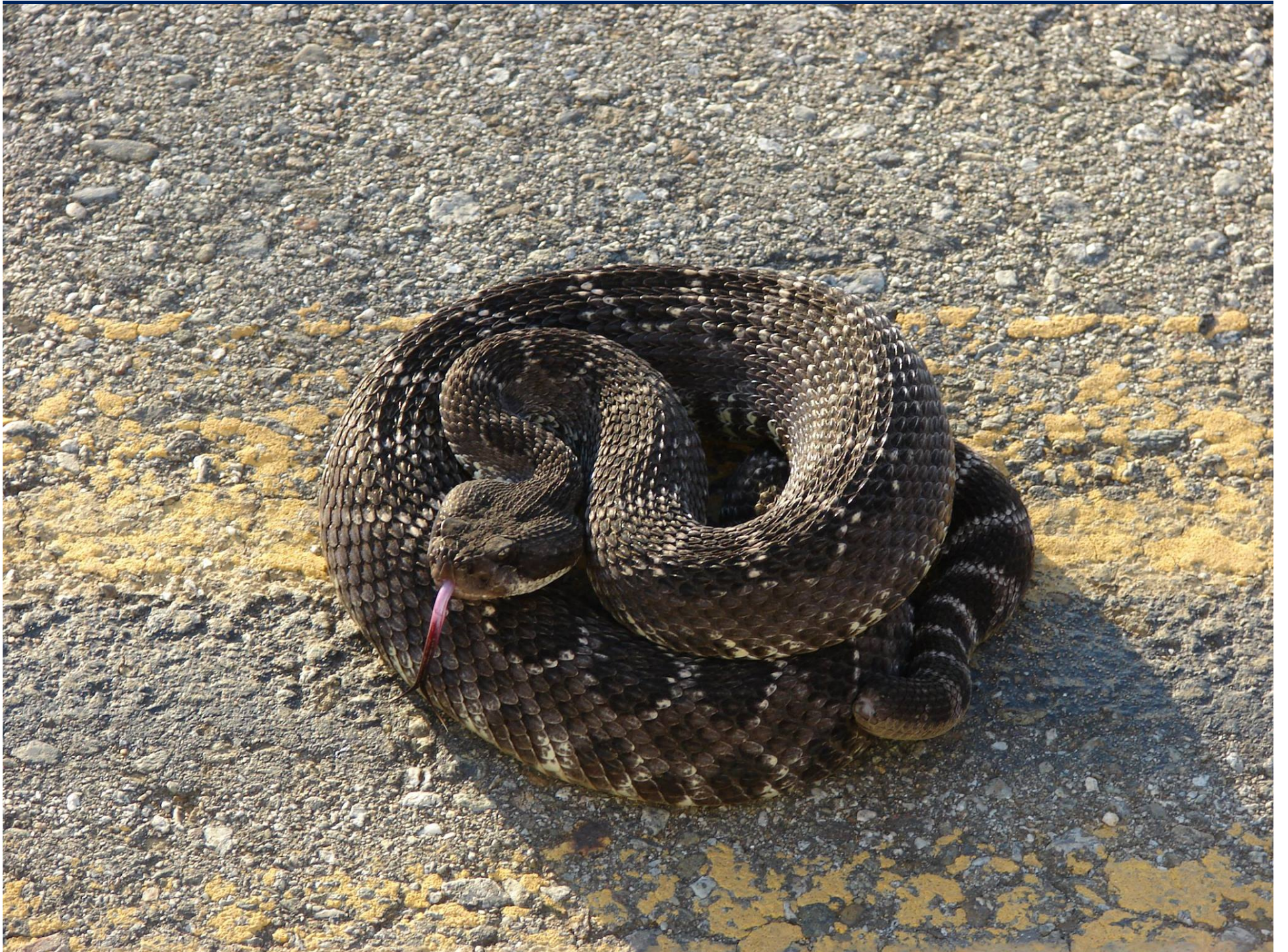

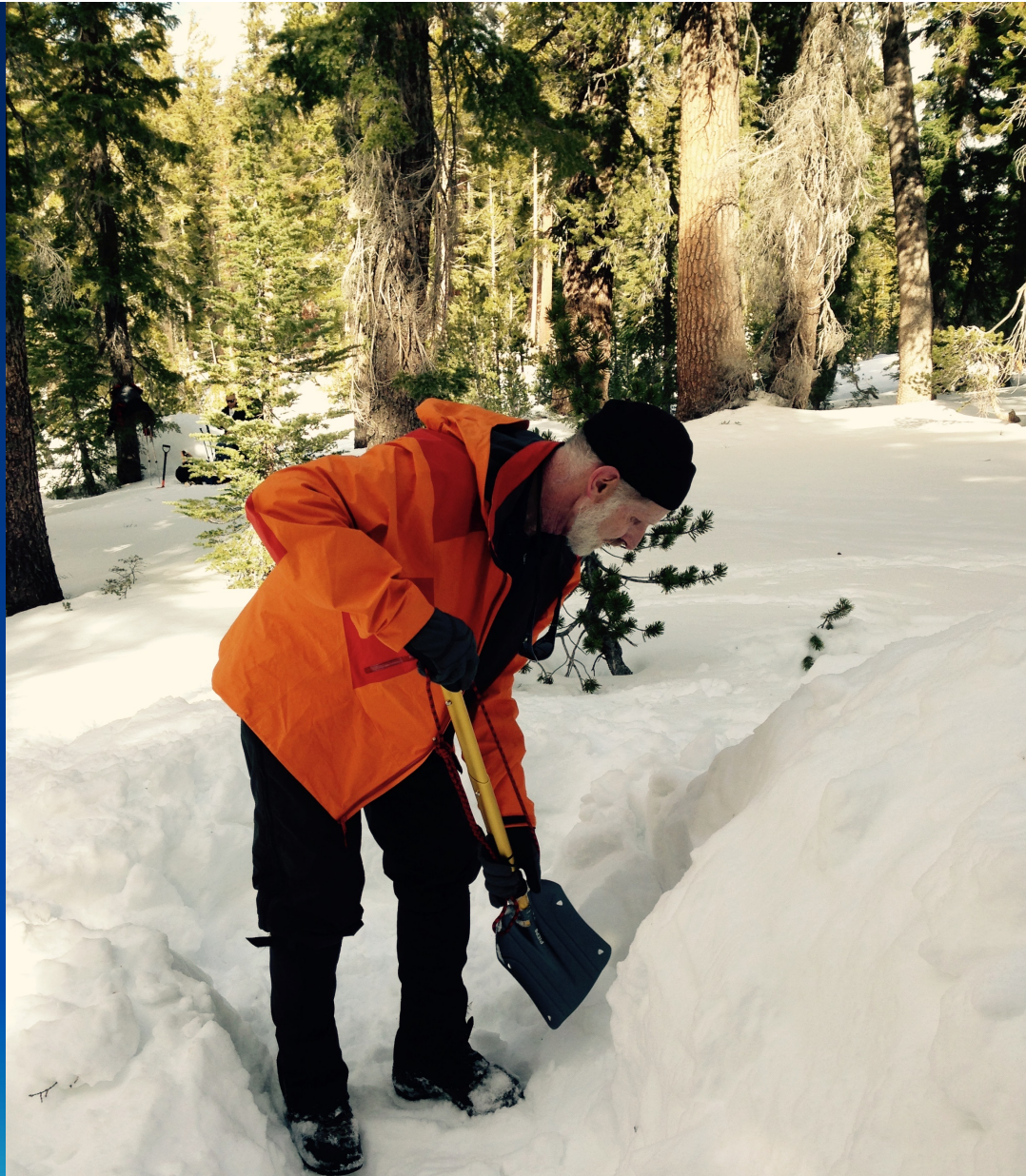



We service 18 square miles with approximately 69.9 miles of marked trails of which 37.7 can be driven. Approximately 32.7 miles of marked dirt hiking trails with numerous miles of unmarked trails.

Approximately 964,721 visitors per year:

Eaton Canyon 759,021 persons. (2018 annual attendance, per LA Co. Parks / recreation)

Millard Canyon estimated 45,000 persons per year.

Arroyo Seco estimated 51,200 persons per year.
