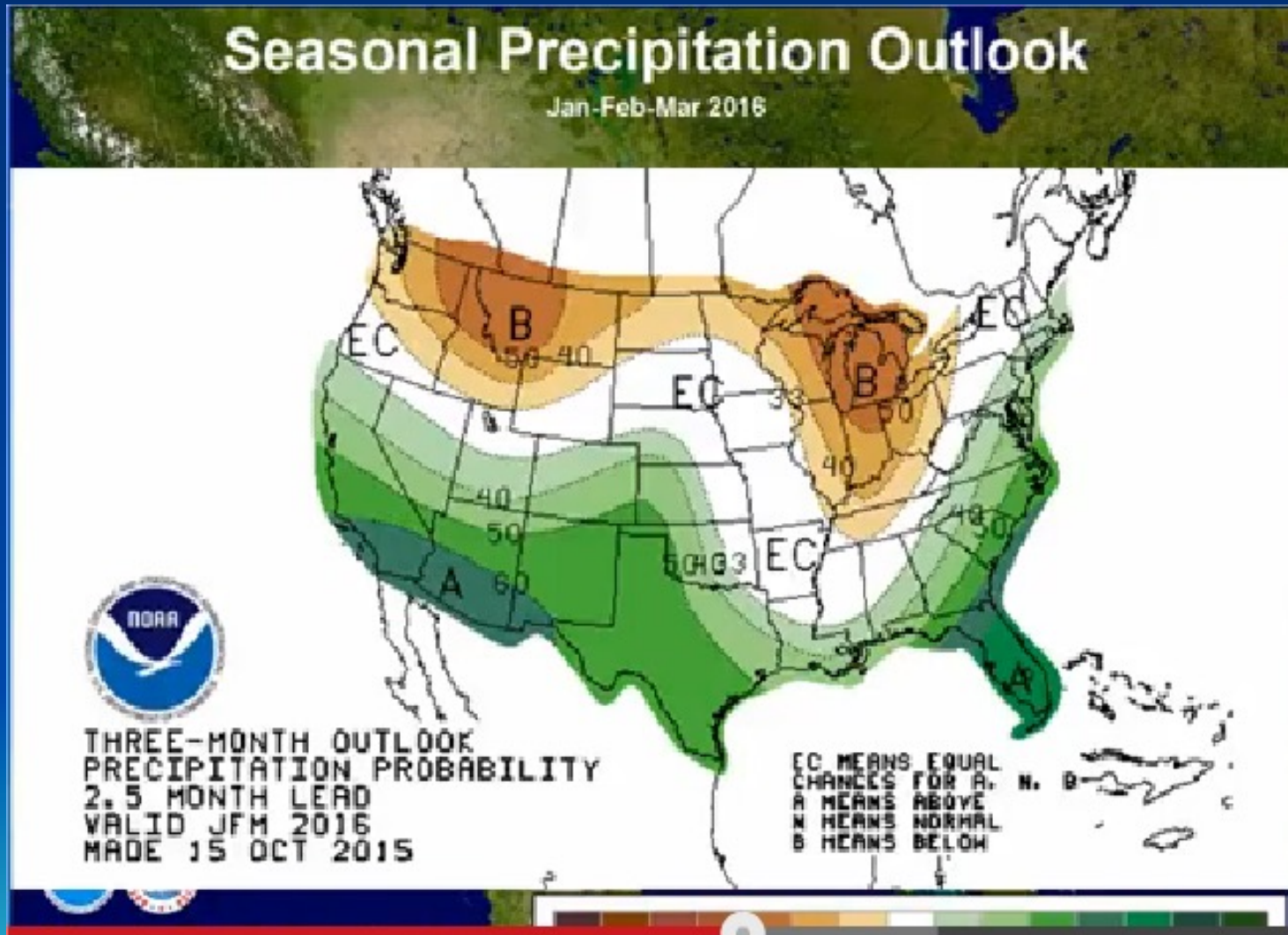


Flood Control District



- Formed in 1915 with Dual Mission
- Reduce Flood Risk by Providing Flood Control Protection
- Conserve Water for local supply

2015-2016 Storm Season Strong El Niño Predicted



Pre-Storm Coordination Activities

- United States Army Corps of Engineers: storm coordination meeting
- National Weather Service: winter hydrology coordination meeting
- California Department of Water Resources: flood coordination meeting
- Community Meetings: for residents living near hillside burn areas.



Pre-Storm Preparation of Road and Flood Control Facilities

- Clean out and remove debris from culverts and catch basins.



Pre-Storm Preparation of Flood Control Facilities

- Clear overgrown vegetation from soft bottom channels.



Arundo Donax Removal

Pre-Storm Preparation of Flood Control Facilities

- Remove sediment and material from debris basins



Pre-Storm Preparation of Flood Control Facilities

- Maintain 14 dams
- Test valves at the dams



Devil's Gate Dam Interim Measures



Pre-Storm Preparation of Water Conservation Facilities

- Remove vegetation and debris from spreading grounds



Pre-Storm Preparation of Water Conservation Facilities

- Inspect and repair rubber dams and intake structures.



Flood Risks

- Encourage residents to know their individual flood risk
- Vulnerable areas with historical drainage issues



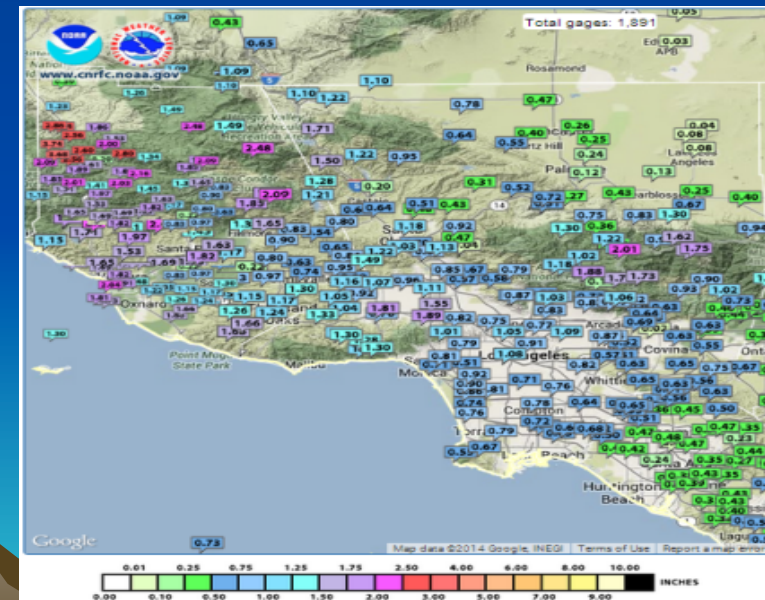
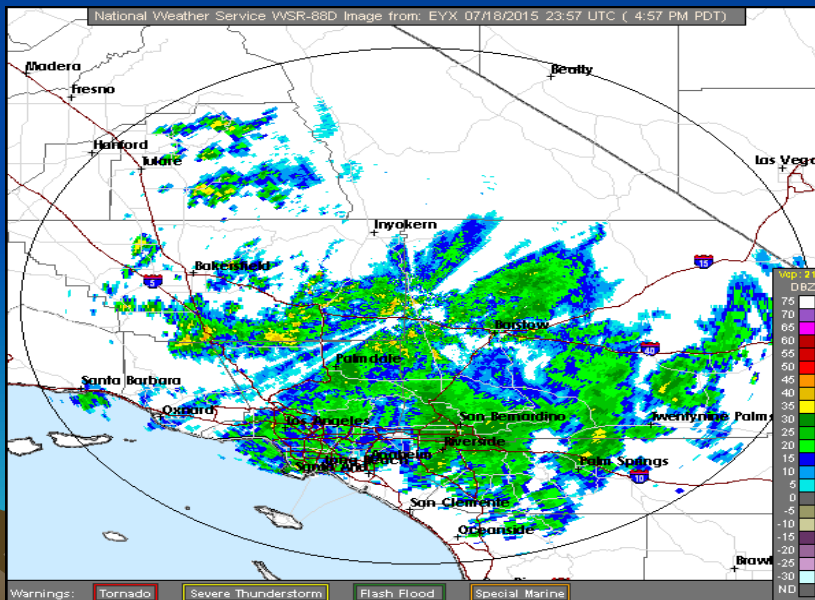
Mudflow Risks

- Increased risk of mudflows below wildfire areas



Storm Operations

- Monitor forecasts from National Weather Service prior to and during rainfall events
- Collect Real-time rainfall, runoff, and water levels at dams
- Check condition of pre-defined vulnerable locations



Storm Operations

- Activate Department Operations Center as necessary
- Coordinate activities with County Office of Emergency Management

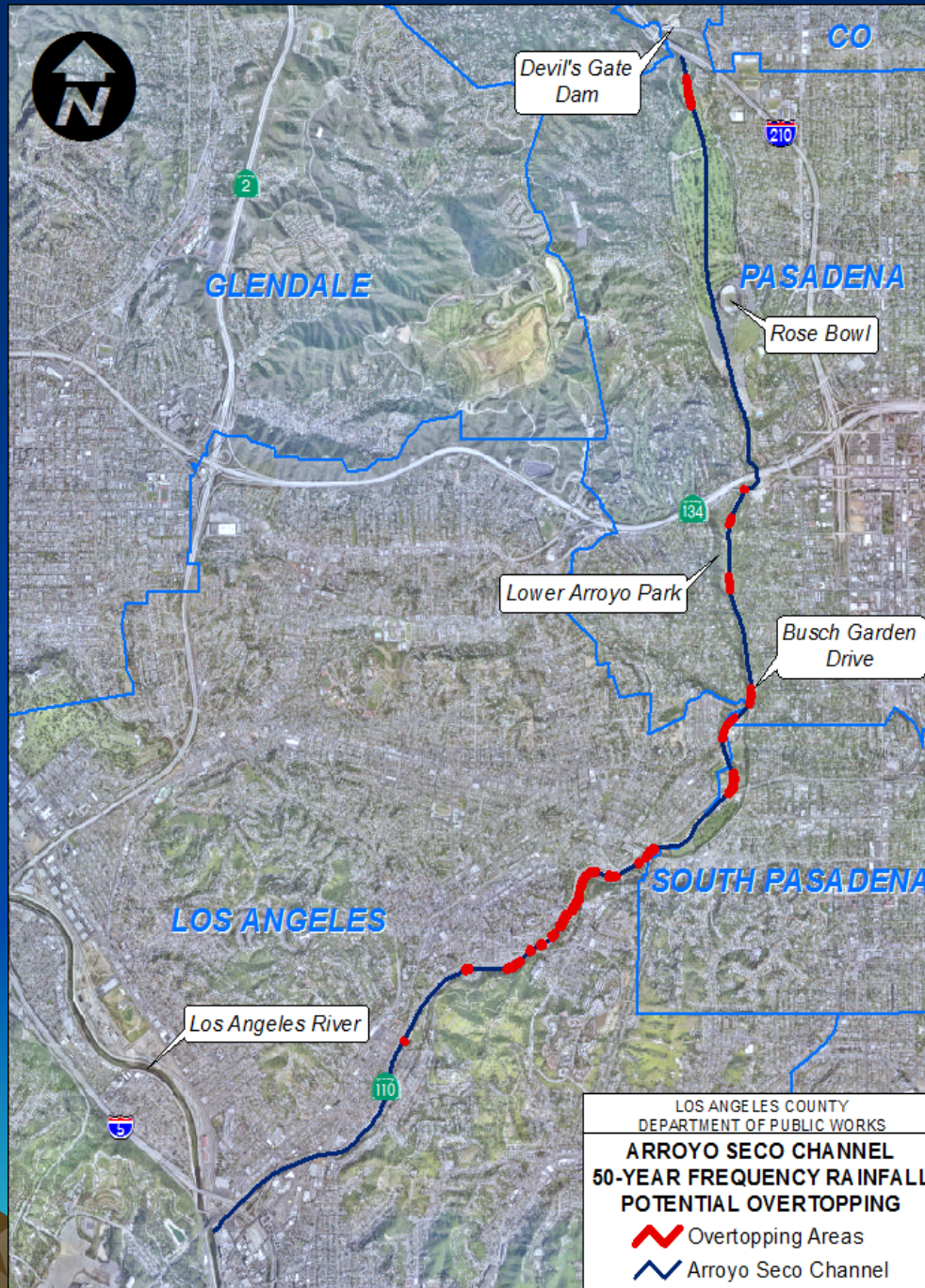

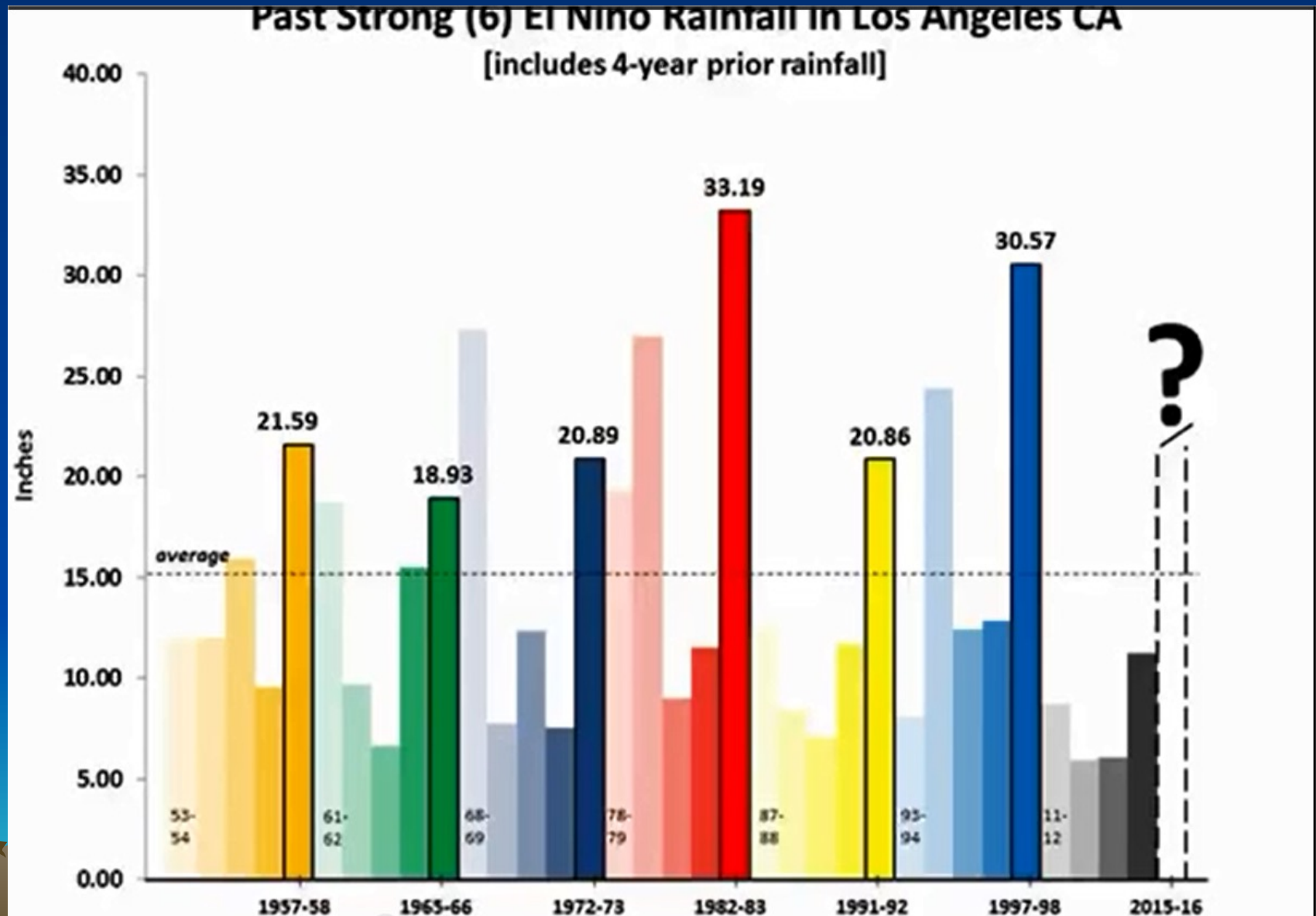
